

180 parking spots

County bids on building, garage

Maricopa County officials recently have offered \$24 million to buy a two-story Maricopa office building that would provide up to 180 newly needed parking spaces for county employees.

The 200,000-sq-ft building is in Phoenix's Plaza area and stands at about 27 1/2 stories. There is a parking garage behind the building, which is owned by the state. Maricopa County is the county's administrative and records building.
