Morristown Partnership Commercial Rent Relief Grant Program

Developed to sustain small businesses

In keeping with its mission to support the Morristown downtown business community, the Morristown Partnership is pleased to announce plans to provide commercial rent relief to area small businesses. A minimum of \$250,000, in aggregate, will be awarded to businesses that apply, meet eligibility requirements and are selected via lottery; award amounts will vary, with no one business receiving more than \$20,000.

"Thanks to a generous anonymous benefactor, who values Morristown and the businesses that make the community so special, we are honored to have had the opportunity to develop, structure and now administer the Morristown Partnership Commercial Rent Relief Grant Program," said Jennifer Wehring, executive director of the Partnership.

Applications for the three-month rent relief will be accepted beginning Wednesday, Sept. 23 at noon up until and including Wednesday, Oct. 7 at 5 p.m. Detailed eligibility requirements are now available on the Morristown Partnership website (www.morristown-nj.org/grants). Beginning Sept. 23, applications

will be made available online; printed applications and grant program information can also be obtained at the Partnership office located at 14 Maple Ave., Suite 201 in Morristown during business hours of Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

At the conclusion of the two-week application window, applicants will be entered into a random lottery system to ensure fair and transparent selection of grant award recipients. Once verified, businesses selected via lottery will be contacted on or about Oct. 15. Grant awards will be used exclusively for three months of rent, not to exceed \$20,000 total, commencing November and concluding January 2021.

A mandatory requirement of all applications is the participation of the businesses' property owner who must comply with a 20% rent reduction for the duration of the three months. Grant awards will be paid in one lump sum directly to the property owner.

"The turmoil of 2020 and its impact on our small business community is a challenge no one, including the Partnership,

could have anticipated," Wehring said. "We are hopeful that this Grant Program will provide much needed relief to our downtown small businesses, as well as benefit the property owners, and bring all closer to a full recovery," Wehring added.

While one benefactor was the catalyst that launched the Morristown Partnership Commercial Rent Relief Grant Program, additional donors have already pledged their support of additional funds. But they don't stop there. You can also count on them to find toys and games with an emphasis on learning to support parents and teachers in the most important job there is, raising children.

The business is run by the mother-daughter team of Diane and Amanda Bowser. Formerly called The Teaching Room, which dates back more than 35 years, Diane and Amanda are the third caretakers/owners of this cherished family-owned business.

They pride themselves on assessing the play value of every toy that goes on their shelves, many manufactured from around the world, and guiding customers to just the right fit for their needs. When stopping by, don't be surprised to see Diane and Amanda playing around with the games or riding around on Plasma Cars. Become a regular customer and you will quickly become part of the family.

Diane moved from New York to Morristown when she married a local boy. She loved the town so much that she went on to raise two children there — who, like their father — are Morristown High School graduates. She's so glad she did.

"I love being a part of the Morristown community; it is so diverse and has something for everyone. The people of Morristown are very generous and are always looking out for their neighbors. COVID-19 has brought out the best in everyone in town and I am so glad we are here to be a part of that," Diane said.

After working in the insurance and banking industries for 20 years, Diane took a seasonal job with Learning Express Toys in Denville wrapping gifts. She fell in love with the business, the people and, of course, the toys, and bought the store. When the possibility to buy The Teaching Room in Morristown arose, the family bought that, too.

"Learning Express and The Teaching Room seemed like the perfect marriage," Diane said. "I was a frequent visitor to the Morristown store with my children and always loved the education value of play."

Amanda, a former visitor to the store with her mother when she was a child, started working at the store in high school. After graduating Marist College with a degree in biology and adolescent education, and then earning a masters degree in biology from Montclair State, she decided to put her education to use in the family business creating fun, engaging and educational activities for kids of all ages.

Amanda currently manages the store. Of utmost importance, now more than ever, she took the reigns in creating and boosting the store's social media presence. The online component came in handy in March when the pandemic caused the temporary shutdown of the business.

"2020 has provided us with new challenges and opportunities to evolve and grow," Amanda said. "Once everything closed in March, we had to quickly adapt and find a way to stay connected to our

customers and most importantly continue to meet their changing needs," she said.

Families were overwhelmed with the seemingly overnight shift to their children learning from home and how to keep pre-school-age children busy. Add to that parents shifting their work to home as well. Learning Express Toys and The Teaching Room came to the rescue, offering contactless curbside pickup as well as delivery service to their customers, and did so almost entirely via social media, specifically Facebook and Instagram.

Now that September, and back-to-school is upon us, the store knows that this means different things to different students. Some will be attending in-person classes, others will continue with remote learning and likely many will experience both. Regardless, it's a time of year when parents and teachers take stock of what is most essential for children and how to best support their development. The store has always maintained a robust calendar of events including book readings and signings by local authors, visits from The Seeing Eye Institute and weekly Tiny Tot programs to engage their youngest guests, foster their creativity and assist in child development.

"With COVID-19 we had to totally change how we looked at in-store events. Our Tiny Tots weekly programs have moved to online via ZOOM," Amanda said. "The kids have actually loved it because they were able to see their friends online and an unexpected bonus was that our audience expanded to across the country."
