Visit Morristown National Historical Park today

If you're a history buff, Morris County offers a treasure trove of places for you to visit, with Morristown National Historical Park being a good place to start feeding your quest for local lore. The park has just celebrated its 90th anniversary in 2023 of it being part of the National Park Service, where Gen. George Washington and his Continental Army wintered twice, not once as in Valley Forge.

The park consists of four non-contiguous areas: Washington's Headquarters Museum, Fort Nonsense, Jockey Hollow and the New Jersey Brigade Area (which includes the Cross Estate and Gardens). Gen. Washington and the Continental Army encamped there from December 1779 to June 1780, where they survived through what would be the coldest winter on record. During that time frame, Washington used the Ford Mansion as his headquarters and base of operations.

The Jockey Hollow Encampment Area is where 10,000 Continental Army soldiers

camped during the winter of 1779-80, now serving as a visitor center. Visitors will see Jockey Hollow come to life on Saturday, April 20 and Sunday, April 21 for the park's Spring Encampment. Re-enactors from across the northeast arrive for this special event, which focuses on the life and times of soldiers and civilians during the Revolutionary War. Highlights for the weekend include demonstrations in camp of cooking, sewing, and other camp chores, military maneuvers, musket firing and a special "children's muster," where children can learn to drill and march like Revolutionary soldiers.

Currently, Morristown National Historical Park is preparing to receive increased visitation for the 250th anniversary of the founding of the United States. The park is working on several preservation and construction initiatives to maintain, improve

accessibility and preserve park infrastructure and facilities.
